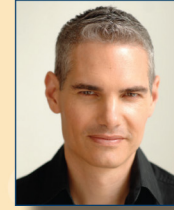

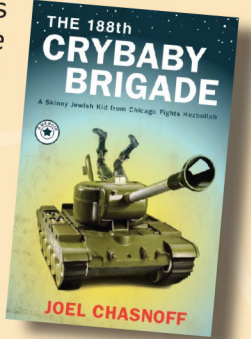

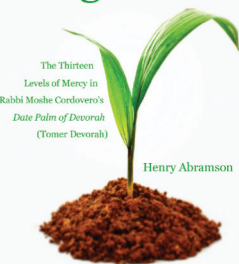
The Kabbalah of Forgiveness

with Author Henry Abramson

Join Author Henry Abramson, Ph.D., Dean at Touro's Lander Colleges, for a fascinating discussion of his new book, *The Kabbalah of Forgiveness*. Abramson analyzes one of the most powerful

works that emerged from the famous 16th-century mystics in Safed, Israel, and describes how these Kabbalistic techniques can bring the healing power of forgiveness into our daily lives. Abramson received his Ph.D. in History from the University of Toronto and has held visiting faculty appointments at Harvard, Cornell, Oxford and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.
